## MSU field house lights an issue

**Q:** At Minnesota State University, every morning I drive by at 4:30 and in the track and field house every single day the lights are on. Over Christmas break the lights are on. Over summer the lights are on. I'm just wondering why they can't shut those lights off. I've asked different members of the main-

**A:** The university acknowledges it can do a better job turning these lights off at night.

"Our initial review indicates these lights are in fact on longer than they should be so we'll take action to make sure they are turned off at the end of evening when the facility is not in use," Sean McGoldrick, MSU's assistant vice president of facilities management, said in an e-mail.

Typically, the lights are left on at night because students are playing for fun — organized sports teams usually wrap up earlier in the evening — sometimes until 11 p.m. or perhaps later, McGoldrick said. He's asked his campus recreation and custodial staff to shut the lights off when everyone's done

playing. For the most part, the campus is on an energy management system that shuts down motors, lights and other systems at 11 p.m. or so, depending on the building, McGoldrick said. In the e-mail, he also

### Chris Cakes supplies entertainment, food for a good cause

They were taking incoming fire at the Morson-Ario VFW Sunday morning.

Fortunately, it was in the form of pancakes.

A fundraiser brought a lot of showmanship along with the breakfast as people used their plates to catch pancakes flipped high in the air as they stood several feet away from Chad Beschoner, of Chris Cakes.

Beschoner said they're willing to sacrifice the cakes that hit the floor to put on a show.

"We miss a lot, but that's the fun of it," said Beschoner, who travels the five state area putting on breakfasts for fundraisers, graduations and community celebrations.

He was happy to see the high ceilings in the Morson-Ario, giving him plenty of room to send cakes flying. "I don't like the low ceilings, you have to toss them sideways."

Besides flipping them high and onto plates, Beschoner sends pancakes flying across the room like Frisbees for people to try to catch at their tables.

The business brings with it everything needed, from the pancakes, sausages and beverages to specially made 8-foot-long grills fired by propane. A stainless steel box atop the grill is rolled along, dropping out pancake mix four at a time.

"We do 48 pancakes at a time on a grill, and we hook together as

many grills as we need. We can make hundreds at once for big events," Beschoner said.

The business began in the late 1960s in Pocahontas, Iowa, when Kiwanis member Lorin Christiansen took over the group's pancake feed and turned the idea into Chris Cakes.

The business now has opera-

tions in Pocahontas (ChrisCakesOfIowa.com) and in Missouri. They have made and sent flying some 30 million pancakes over the years.

Goldie Bosard, president of the Ladies Auxiliary, said they tried Chris Cakes for this year's

**Unlikely visit helps mother heal**

**Marine Corps flag sparks friendship after son's death**

**BAYPORT** — When Adrienne Johnson answered the doorbell at her Bayport home, she found a stranger standing outside.

The stranger — Bill Pederson of Mauston, Wis. — said he had been visiting a cousin and had noticed the U.S. Marine Corps flag flying in Johnson's front yard. It was Nov. 4, 2010 — six days before the Marines' 235th birthday.

Pederson, a former Marine, said he stopped because he "wanted to greet the Marine and wish him a 'happy birthday.'"

Adrienne explained that "the Marine" was her 19-year-old son, Dane, who had died in a motorcycle accident in 2005. She said she had just that morning visited his grave.

"I stood there in shock, wondering what to say or do next," Pederson recalled. "I told her how bad I felt and that I was sorry for her loss. I told her, 'Semper Fi.'"

For Adrienne, the visit was a sign from God.

"The day that you stopped at my door was such a wonderful reminder of our dear son," she wrote in a letter to Pederson a few weeks after his visit. "I (was) wondering how many people still remember him. Then, as if heaven sent you, you showed up at our door to wish our son a Happy Marine Birthday. You'll never know how much you touched me."

Pederson is 65. He grew up in Starbuck, Minn., and served from 1963 to 1966 in the Marines, where he was trained as an electronics technician. He is a retired ATM serviceman. He and his wife, Lorna, have two sons and three grandsons. Their son, Paul, served in the Marines from 1987 to 1993. The license-plate

holder on Pederson's Chevrolet LTZ crew cab four-wheel-drive pickup truck reads "Once a Marine, Always a Marine." A "Semper Fi" sticker is on the trailer hitch.

"I am a Marine — there are no former Marines," said Pederson, who wore a Marine Corps baseball cap, T-shirt and sweatshirt when he stopped by to visit Adrienne again recently.

"Marines, they hang together," he said. "It's a tight-knit group. There are only two people who understand Marines — and that's Marines and the enemy. It's hard to explain — unless you've been there. ... I think a mother, especially a mother who has lost a son, could understand. This kid was gung-ho. It's just a shame."

After that day on the doorstep, Pederson wrote to "Leatherneck," the Marine Corps' monthly magazine, about meeting Adrienne. "She said, 'Thanks for stopping. You made my day!'" he wrote. "It is hard to explain, but I felt a bond with that mother and was glad I had stopped. You just never know."

The editors picked Pederson's letter as "Letter of the Month" for January and sent him a \$25 check. Pederson told his cousin Karen Lampi, who lives in Bayport, about what had happened. She told him about Dane and a place in Bayport named after him.

Pederson decided to donate the \$25 to Dane's Place, a shelter house for families in transition. He found Bob and Adrienne Johnson's address online and mailed them a check.

"Even though we have never met, (Dane) will always be my brother," Pederson wrote to them.

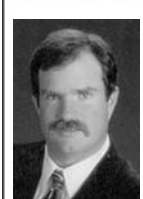

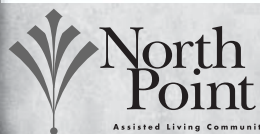

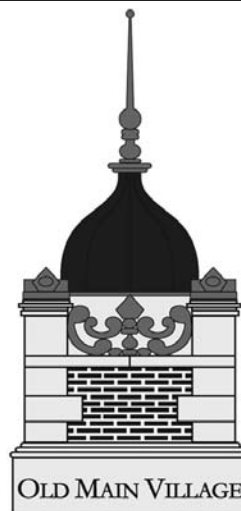

# Guilty plea in hoarding case

**DULUTH** — A Two Harbors man accused of hoarding more than 100 cats has pleaded guilty to animal neglect and maltreatment.

Prosecutors say 70-year-old Edward Todd Stoehr agreed Friday to a sentence of 180 days in jail,

stayed for two years as part of a plea deal. He'll also be fined \$1,500 of which all but \$250 will be stayed.

The Duluth News Tribune reported felony charges of animal cruelty were reduced to misdemeanors as part of the plea deal.

Stoehr, the former direc-

tor of the Lake Superior Humane Society, can keep the one dog he owns, provided a veterinarian determines it's in good health. He can also have up to two other animals if, after six months of probation, a psychologist decides he's mentally fit.

He'll be formally sentenced March 17.

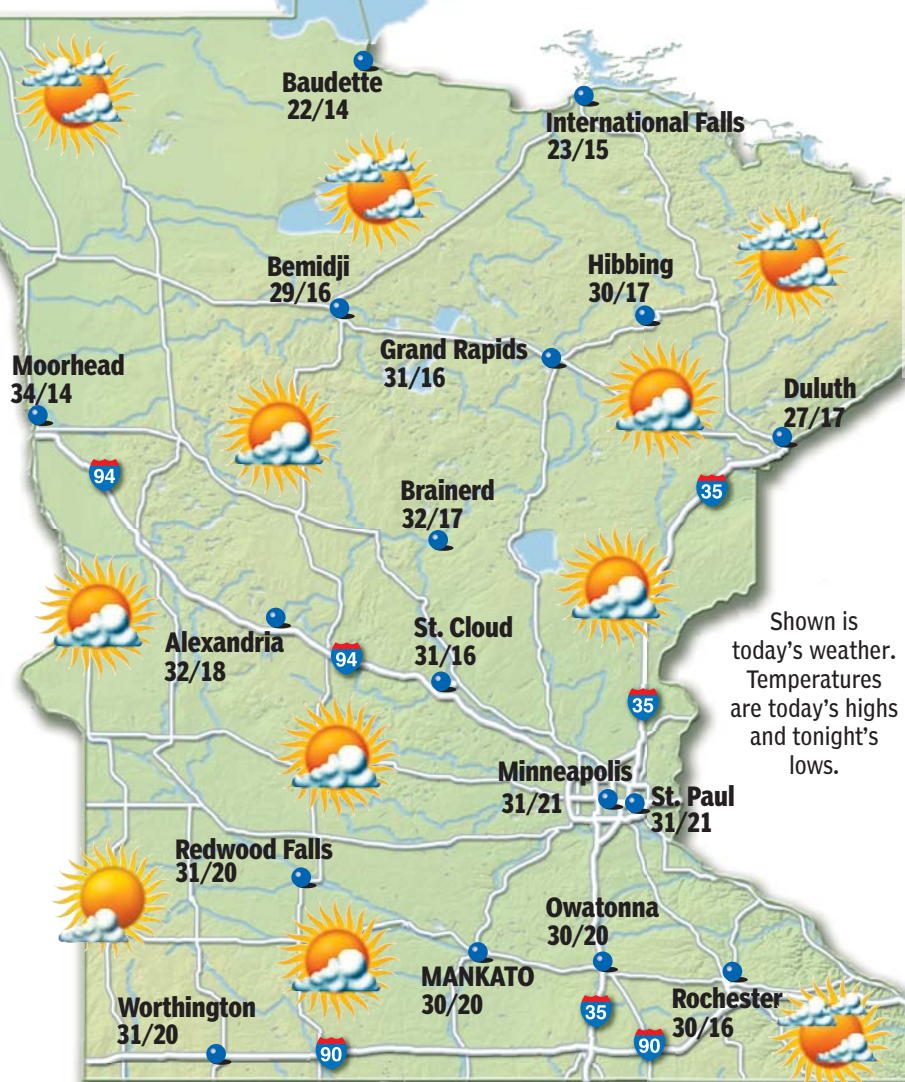

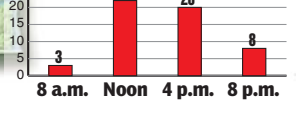

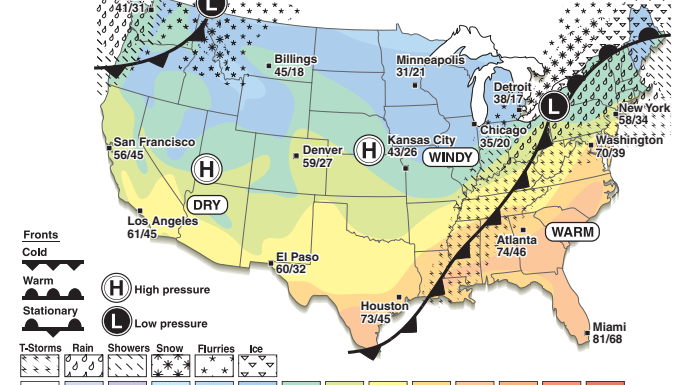

# Man held in death of woman

**BROOKLYN PARK** — A man is in jail after a woman was found dead in a burning Brooklyn Park home. Police said officers were asked to do a welfare check at the home early Saturday. They found two unharmed children inside and removed them to safety. The officers also found smoke and called for firefighters. Authorities then discovered the body of the woman. Officers arrested the suspect at another location later Saturday morning. Police aren't saying yet how the woman died or what her relationship was with the suspect. Her name has not been released.

# Copper thieves strike museum

**MINNEAPOLIS** — Copper thieves have struck the Firefighters Hall and Museum in northeast Minneapolis. A trustee noticed missing condenser coils in damaged air conditioning units while he was checking out a possible ice dam problem on the building's roof. Officials believe the theft happened late one night this month. Trustee Jean Kidd told KARE-TV it would cost over \$16,000 to repair their two units. Instead, the social hall and museum will buy a pair of new units for \$13,000. The station said the worth of the stolen copper is a small fraction of that. Trustees expect insurance to cover some but not all the costs. Minneapolis police said copper theft is on the rise at commercial and especially residential properties. They say everyone is susceptible, including abandoned and foreclosed homes.
